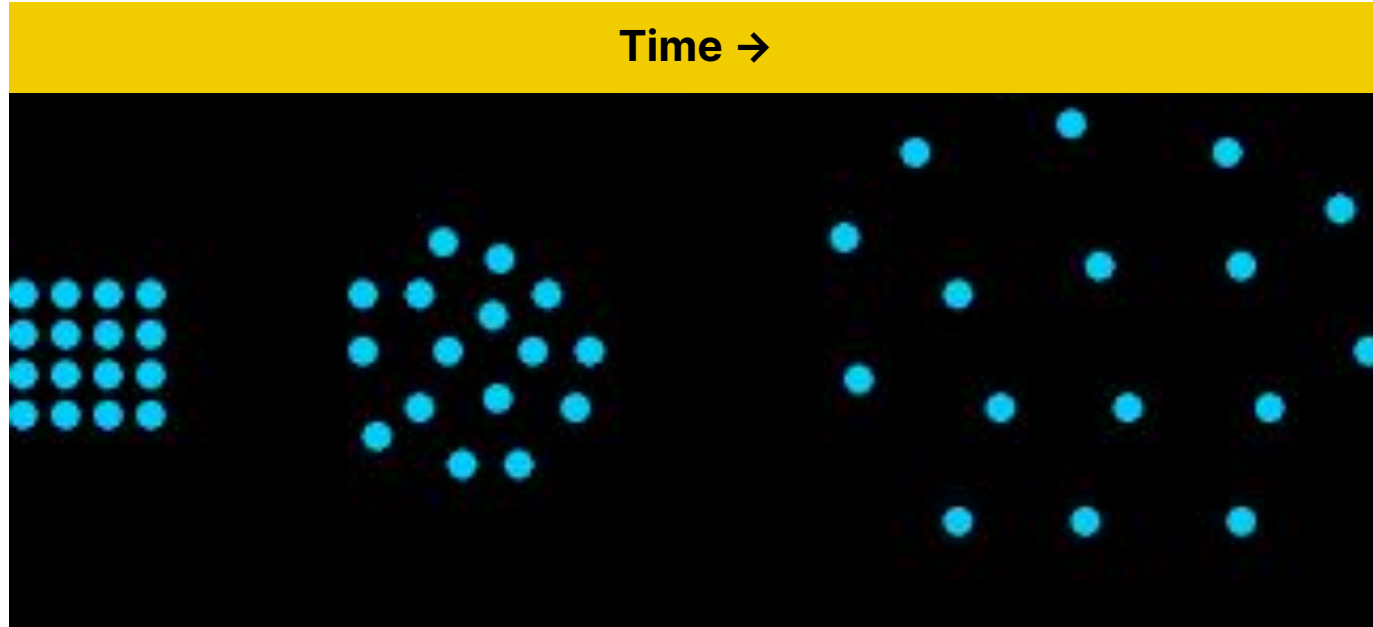

The Big Idea

As a project we must acknowledge that maintenance is hard work, but work that must be done for the platform to be fit for use.

We Accomplish This by Having

- A named person or persons who are responsible for getting the work done
- A measurable definition of “well-maintained”
- Feedback loops to ensure accountability and continuous improvement of our processes.

What Is Maintenance Really?

- Package upgrades, security patches, bug fixes
- Code reviews and attention to submitted issues
- Availability to answer questions and unblock users and community members
- Creating and updating documentation
- Having a plan for the software: what now, what next, how to do it

The Burden of Maintenance

Maintenance accounts for around 30% of development effort. [[Tidelift, 2019](#)]



Facts and Fallacies of Software Engineering

Fact 43: Maintenance is a solution not a problem.



How to Avoid Eating the World?

- Focus on the non-negotiables
- Automate as much as possible
- Deprecate and remove code that doesn't give us joy

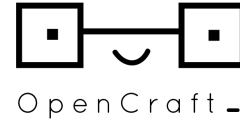

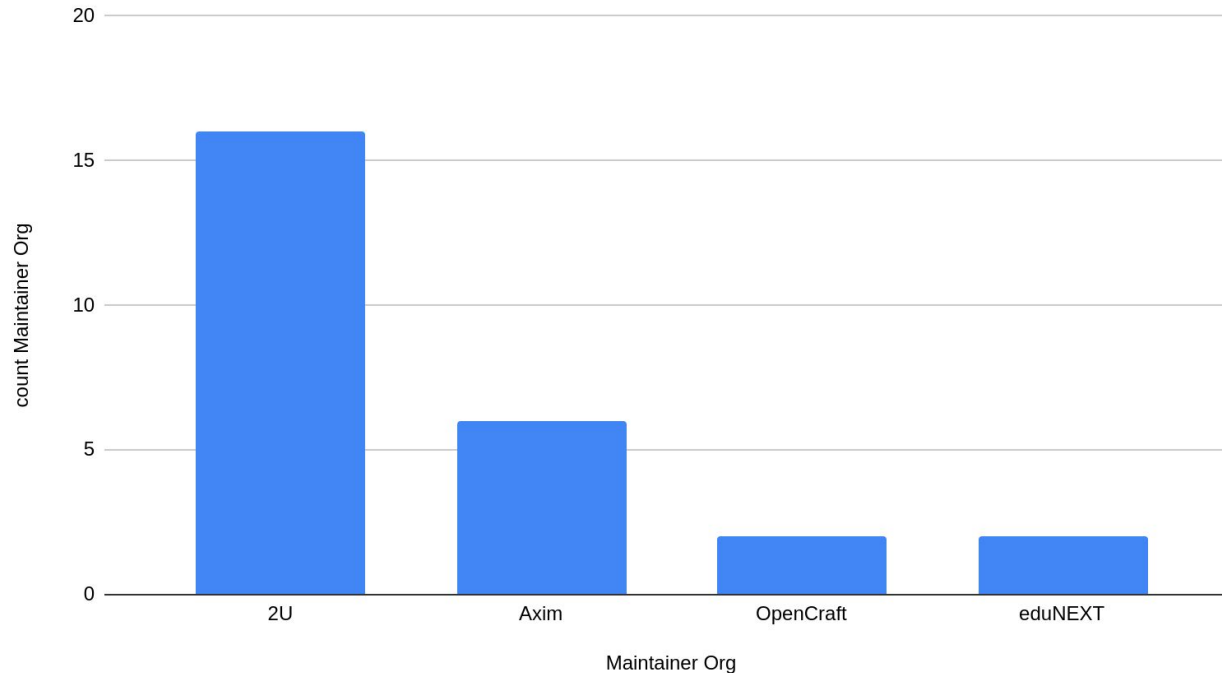
